## JUDGE AND SCORE THE BAKES

All players who complete a Bake are awarded I Recipe Score token: a Soggy Bottom, a Great Bake, OR a coveted Hollywood Handshake. Each player's Bake is judged by the other players. To receive a Recipe Score token, the Bake must meet the criteria for that level as well as the prior levels listed above on the Recipe card.

#### LAVA CAKE RECIPE SCORE EXAMPLE Note: Cards with a dotted outline are optional and not required to complete a Bake. Soggy Bottom Lava Cake Mixture Great Bake × No Soggy √ Fruit Filling Hollywood Handshake

- I. Player I completed the Bake but used Soggy cards and Spice Filling. They score a Soggy Bottom.
- 2. Player 2 has no Soggy cards and used Fruit Filling. They only have I Good Crumb, though, and no Style card. They score a Great Bake. Note that Raising Agent cards can be used in place of Regular Mixture cards even if they aren't called for.
- 3. Player 3 used | Fruit Filling, 2 Good Crumb, and 1 Style card. They score a Hollywood Handshake!



## GET READY FOR THE NEXT ROUND

Players remove any Wild! Bake cards they used in their Bakes and return them face up to the center of the play area. All players collect their Bake decks and shuffle them. Reset all Bin tokens (if used). Place the next Recipe in the category on the Recipe Stand and read it carefully. Put out new Timer Score tokens.

### HOW TO WIN

After 3 Recipes (Signature, Technical, and Showstopper), players add up their Timer Score tokens and their Recipe Score tokens. The player with the most points is the Star Baker!

## GET TO KNOW THE BAKE DECK


The Bake deck is made up of different types of cards: Mixture, Rye, Filling, Icing, Style, and Help!

There are 4 Mixture cards. Any Mixture card can be used in a Recipe when Regular Mixture is shown. Players will score more points for using Good Crumb cards and less for using Soggy cards. Raising Agent cards can be used in Recipes as a Regular Mixture card even if they aren't called for.



## SETUP

- I. Assemble the Recipe Stand by folding along the 3 dotted lines and inserting the sides into the slots.
- 2. Give each player 1 Baker Workbench, its matching Bake deck, and 1 Bin token.
- 3. Choose a Recipe category-Cake, Biscuits, Dessert, Pastry, Bread, or International. Find the Signature, Technical, and Showstopper Recipes from the category. All players will make the same 3 Recipes.
- 4. Put the 8 Wild! Bake cards face up in the center of the play area.
- 5. Each player shuffles their Bake deck.
- 6. Put the Timer Score tokens in the center of the play area, according to the number of players:
  - Four players: 5, 3, 2, 1
  - Three players: 3, 2, 1
  - Two players: 3, 1
- 7. Put the Signature Recipe on the Recipe Stand where everyone can see it. One player reads the Recipe aloud.

# HOW TO PLAY


When everyone is ready, one player says, "On Your Marks, Get Set ... Bake!" All players play at the same time as quickly as they can.

Players start by drawing the top card from their Bake deck. They either use it to build their Bake in front of them or place it face up in 1 of 3 Discard piles on their Baker Workbench. Players continue drawing and using cards in this same fashion. Once they have cards in their Discard piles, they can either draw I card from their Bake deck or draw the top card from any of their Discard piles.

Players must start their Bake with a card from the bottom row of the Recipe. Any subsequent card played must touch a card already in the Bake. Players cannot reshuffle their Discard piles when they run out of cards in their hand, so they must plan carefully!

When a Recipe features this symbol (x3), players must build 3 of the item to complete the Recipe.

## HOW TO PLAY (EXAMPLE)



## **HELP! CARDS**



When a player draws a Help! card, they can exchange it for ] Wild! Bake card from the center of the play area and use that card in their Bake.

#### BIN



Players can use their Bin token once per Bake to throw out any number of cards in their Bake. When Bake cards are removed, players put them aside (not in their Discard piles) and continue playing, making sure any new card played in the Bake touches an existing card. Players flip over their Bin token once it's used.

### TIME'S UP!

When players finish their Bake, they grab the highest remaining Timer Score token from the center of the play area and declare that they are done. The Timer Score tokens are worth varying amounts of points, so the faster players work, the more points they'll score. When the last green Timer Score token has been taken, all players must stop baking immediately. The player who hasn't finished receives the red Timer Score token. That player can play the top cards on their Discard piles to try to complete their Bake.
